There he is said to have built a causeway to Scotland using hexagonal rocks, which upset his arch enemy "Benandonner" the Scottish Giant, and a great battle ensued. To this day, there remain hexagonal rocks for all to see at the Isle of Staffa in Scotland; however, the main breathtaking formations, with over 38,000 basalt columns, are situated at the Giant's Causeway World Heritage Site, County Antrim, Northern Ireland.

Legend of the Irish Giant, with its bold bass lines, fiery ostinatos, and modal themes, brings this great legend to life in music, painting the picture of the epic battle between Finn and Benandonner.
