## Bayou Breakdown

ayou Breakdown began as an attempt to write a fugue in the style of S. Back The main melody is introduced in a four-part fugue scored for woodwinds. transition gives way to a second statement of the fugue by the brass. Another transition introduces a folk song-like lyrical theme based on a pentatonic scale. A brief transition takes the piece to its most dissonant section, evoking a poorly played waltz. The main melody attempts to reappear but is swept away by a progression of descending chromatic chords. After a complete stop, the initial fugue returns featuring solos by the clarinet, bassoon, alto saxophone, oboe, trumpet, and tuba. After a few short trio statements of the main tune, the piece ends with a polyphonic flurry from the full band.

In writing Bayou Breakdown I hoped to create a piece that would provide musical and technical challenges for performers yet could be immediately enjoyed by the listener, musician and non-musician alike. While the piece was written for my terrific students in the University of Toledo Wind Ensemble, it is dedicated to one of my most influential mentors, Frank Wickes, Director of Bands at Louisiana State University
