#### **PROGRAM NOTES**

Commissioned by the Georgia Music Educators Association 13th District Middle School Honor Band, SILVER WINDS is a unique and exciting piece that offers the vigorous action of a roller coaster, combined with the aesthetics of a late twentieth-century musical masterpiece.

Listeners will enjoy the musical journey, from the haunting beginning to the dark heroic melody, with the ostinato masterfully written to appear in a seamless fashion. Beautiful color is added to the melody with the entrance of the baritones, flutes and clarinets. The lyrical section involves a chorale-like clarinet choir accompanying a beautiful oboe solo. The rousing finale brings eighth-note triplets written on top of quarternote triplets with the pulse carried by the low voices as this work races to a close. SILVER WINDS is exciting to conduct, prepare and perform.

#### NOTES TO THE CONDUCTOR

SILVER WINDS is an opportunity for your students to grow in their musical maturity. The composition's challenges offer great opportunities to teach a variety of 6/8 rhythms, triplet rhythms, and hemiola patterns. Occasionally, advanced fingering combinations for many of the wind instruments are used in the triplet patterns. Once mastered, the repetitious nature of these components ensures a successful teaching and performing experience.

Beginning in measure 65, you may choose to only have one player from each of the lower voices play. For added excitement, you may choose to add an accelerando and crescendo from measures 80 to 84, followed by a grand pause allowing the suspended cymbal to bridge the transition to the final musical statement.
